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INTRODUCTION

This teacher's guide to Internet resources was developed by Sarasota County Public School teachers to enrich the language arts curriculum and encourage the use of interdisciplinary activities. This guide is designed to supplement the reading selection "Let Me Hear You Whisper," by Paul Zindel, in the Holt, Rinehart, and Winston textbook, "Elements of Literature: Second Course," for eighth grade students.

Disclaimer: Due to the fact that Internet resources change frequently, it is advisable that all teachers carefully review the Internet sites listed in this guide before using them with their students.

Title of reading selection: " Let Me Hear You Whisper" by Paul Zindel

Synopsis of selection: This selection is a play. It is realistic fiction. The human characters interact with the dolphins suggesting actual communication with the mammals.

Menu Of Activities

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ACTIVITY: 1 "Let Me Call You Sweetheart!" (Language Arts, Music)

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Introduction: In this activity, students will listen and react to the music "Let Me Call You Sweetheart." Class discussion will center around the connection between the music and the story.

Grouping: Pairs or whole group

Materials needed:

- Computer with Internet access

Procedure for teacher:

- Read and discuss "Let Me Hear You Whisper."
- Create a bookmark for the "Let Me Call You Sweetheart" website.
- Students access the website to listen to the lyrics and music of the song, "Let Me Call You Sweetheart."
- Students discuss with their partner their reactions to the lyrics and music.
- Students discuss the connections to the story.
- NOTE: Due to copyright law, lyrics and sound clip should not be duplicated and/or distributed.

Procedure for students:

- Read and discuss "Let Me Hear You Whisper."
- Use the bookmark or type in the URL to go to the "Let Me Call You Sweetheart" website.
- Listen to the lyrics and music of the song, "Let Me Call You Sweetheart."
- Discuss with your partner your reactions to the lyrics and music.
- Discuss connections to the story.

ACTIVITY 2: Your Opinion Matters (Florida Writes!)

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Introduction: In this activity, students have the opportunity to learn more about writing a persuasive essay.

Sarasota County Curriculum Correlation:

- **LANGUAGE ARTS 5.5.3: Write a persuasive essay relevant to an intended audience, purpose and occasion.**

Grouping: This activity may be completed as a learning station in the one computer classroom or with an entire class in the computer lab.

Materials needed:

- Computer with Internet access
- Paper
- Pencil

Procedure for teacher:

- Read and discuss "Let Me Hear You Whisper."
- Discuss fact and opinion with students.
- Create a bookmark for the "Guide to Grammar and Writing" website.
- Students access the website and read the principles of composition.
- Students decide on a topic and write a persuasive essay.

Procedure for students:

- Read and discuss "Let Me Hear You Whisper."
- Use the bookmark or type in the URL to go to the "Guide to Grammar and Writing" website.
- On the bottom menu bar, click on "Composition."
- Scroll down to the "Patterns of Composition" menu and click on "The Argumentative Essay."
- Read the information provided on this page and scroll down to the menu for "Principles of Composition."
- Click on and the various sections and read the information provided concerning the principles of composition.
- Decide on a topic for the persuasive essay you will write.
- Write a persuasive essay, using the information learned from the website.

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ACTIVITY 3: Adopt a Dolphin! (Science)

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Introduction: In this activity, students view and discuss various dolphins which are available for adoption. Students create a picture of a dolphin, using information found on the Internet.

Sarasota County Curriculum Correlation:

- **SCIENCE 7.2.2: Describe the ways that human activities may deliberately or inadvertently alter the equilibrium in the ecosystem.**

Grouping: Individual or small group.

Materials needed:

- Drawing paper
- Crayons or markers
- Computer with Internet access

Procedure for teacher:

- Read and discuss "Let Me Hear You Whisper."
- Discuss the purpose of the Internet site.
- Discuss the process of tracking dolphins and dolphin identification.
- Discuss issues related to adopting a dolphin.
- Create a bookmark for the "Adopt a Dolphin" website.
- Students access the website and read about a dolphin available for adoption.
- Students read the information on the website about identifiable markings and coloration of dolphins.
- Students create a picture of one of the dolphins, including the identifiable markings and coloration of the dolphin. Include information about the geographic location where the dolphin can be found, as well as any interesting information provided about the dolphin's name.

Procedure for students:

- Use the bookmark or type in the URL to go to the "Adopt a Dolphin" website.
- Scroll down and click on "Meet the Dolphins."
- Read the information about the dolphins available for adoption.
- Create a picture of one of the dolphins, including the identifiable markings and coloration of the dolphin. Include information about the geographic location where the dolphin can be found, as well as any interesting information provided about the dolphin's name.

ACTIVITY 4: Test Your Ocean Knowledge! (Math, Science, Language Arts)

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Introduction: In this activity, the teacher selects from five lessons to test students' knowledge in Math, Science, and Language Arts.

Grouping: Individual

Materials needed:

- Computer with Internet access
- Printer

Procedure for teacher:

- Read "Let Me Hear You Whisper."
- Discuss how math, science and language arts connect to the story.
- Create a bookmark for the "Neptune's Web" webpage.
- Students access the webpage and select one of the activities listed.
- Students print the selected activity.

- Students complete the printed activity, using paper and pencil, and then return to the website to check their answers.

Procedure for students:

- Read "Let Me Hear You Whisper."
- Use the bookmark or type in the URL to go to the "Neptune's Web" webpage.
- Choose one activity and print the activity.
- Use paper and pencil to complete the printed activity.
- Return to website above to check your answers.

Grouping: Individual

Materials needed:

- Computer with Internet access
- Printer
- Varies according to activity selected

Procedure for teacher:

- Read and discuss "Let Me Hear You Whisper."
- Discuss the contents of the website with students.
- Create a bookmark for the "Treasures @ Sea" website.
- Students access the website and read the directions provided for the five art activities.
- Students decide which art activity they will complete.
- Students print the directions for the chosen art activity.

- Students bring from home the materials needed to complete project.

Procedure for students:

- Read and discuss "Let Me Hear You Whisper."
- Use the bookmark or type in the URL to go to the "Treasures @ Sea" website.
- Read the directions provided for the five art activities.
- Choose which art activity you would like to complete.
- Print the directions for the art activity.
- Bring from home any materials needed to complete project.
- Complete the art project and display it for others to share.
